The Cooper Center for Environmental Learning (Cooper Center), an outreach program of the College of Education, provides memorable experiences in the Sonoran Desert to learners of all ages. It focuses on key ecological understandings through immersive programs that build strong positive emotional connections between participants and the natural world, with a goal of inspiring each person to live more lightly and sustainably on our planet. More than 140,000 people have participated in its programs since 1964, and more than 5,000 people visit Cooper each year.

Cooper Center has the potential to be a key component of UArizona Campus Sustainability as the University moves forward with strategic initiatives to engage students, faculty, staff, alumni, and the community at large. While some elements of improving sustainability on campus are physical in nature, such as changes to infrastructure, winning over the hearts and minds of the University's many constituencies and changing environmentally related attitudes and behaviors is what will ultimately allow us to reach our ambitious goals. Cooper Center can be a hub for educational programming related to sustainability across discipline areas, through experiences specifically crafted to University audiences. It has successfully hosted undergraduate and graduate student interns and would like to expand these opportunities throughout campus. Cooper Center also hopes to continue to serve as a valuable component of educational research related to environmental learning.

In order for Cooper Center to become a more widely used resource at UArizona, we propose to host an Open House during the Spring 2022 semester. This event will be promoted widely across campus, knowing that sustainability is an interdisciplinary topic that can be found in courses and programs in almost every college and department on campus. While Cooper Center staff and volunteers would coordinate the event, there would be significant involvement from UArizona leadership, the Office of Sustainability, and other campus units interested in being part of the festivities.

In addition to providing the opportunity for guests to experience Cooper Center, the other main attraction of the event would be well-renowned guest speakers, live music, and food. Logistically, Cooper Center would provide transportation to and from campus for students, faculty, and staff.

The desired outcomes from this event will be to see a significant increase in the use of Cooper Center as a University resource. This would include student internships and volunteer experiences, facility use for special events, meetings, retreats, workshops, and classes, educationally focused research, and more. Cooper Center will be able to measure this usage increase and gauge the success of the event.

The Campus Sustainability Fund award would be used for costs related to the event – speaker fees, live music, shuttle transportation, food, and event-related materials.
