

Event Agenda and Details

1. Informational/Recruitment Meetings

- **Purpose:** To introduce students to the project, outline the benefits of sustainability certifications (ENV SP, LEED Green Associate, Green Globes Emerging Professional), and recruit interested participants.
- **Leadership:** Led by Project Managers Esteban Hinojos & Eric Le Peau, with Industry professionals
- **Location:** CE Room 214, in the Civil Engineering building (provided free of charge).
- **Guest Speakers:** Industry professionals will present at the meetings to provide insight into the certifications and career benefits, volunteering their time at no cost to the project.
- **Refreshments:** Light refreshments will be provided, including snacks such as granola bars, and bottled water. This small selection is meant to encourage attendance and create a welcoming atmosphere.
- **Frequency:** Two informational/recruitment meetings will be held, scheduled at different times to accommodate various student schedules.

2. Bi-weekly Study Sessions

- **Purpose:** To provide ongoing support to students pursuing certifications, allowing them to study together, review materials, and ask questions in a collaborative environment.
- **Leadership:** Led by Project Managers Esteban Hinojos and Eric Le Peau, who will facilitate group discussions and offer guidance on certification content, students will collaborate aiding each other in the process through online training modules.
- **Location:** CE Room 214 in the Civil Engineering building (provided free of charge).
- **Schedule:** Sessions will be held every other week, with additional sessions scheduled based on student interest and need.
- **Food:** No food or refreshments will be provided for these study sessions, as they are intended to be focused, informal working sessions.

3. Debrief/Celebration Session

- **Purpose:** To celebrate students who have completed their certifications, provide a platform for sharing experiences, and discuss ways to apply their new skills on campus and within student organizations.

- **Leadership:** Hosted by the Project Managers in collaboration with the DBIA (Design-Build Institute of America) club.
- **Location:** DBIA club meeting space (free of charge).
- **Timing:** Scheduled after spring break, providing students with a clear goal for certification completion by this time.
- **Activities:** This session will include presentations by certified students on how they plan to incorporate sustainability into campus projects, student clubs, and their future careers. It will serve as both a reflection and motivation session for ongoing sustainability efforts.
- **Food:** Dinner will be provided as a celebratory meal for participants, likely including options from the union. This meal is no more than \$10 a plate per person and will be a modest celebration, recognizing the hard work of students who completed their certification requirements.
